FREE KINDERGARTEN FEES



PURPOSE

This policy will provide clear guidelines for:

- free kindergarten funding for funded sessional kindergarten programs
- reduced fees for children enrolled in a funded kindergarten program in a long day care centre
- the application of surplus funding within Doncaster Kindergarten ensuring it is only used to ensure the quality of program delivery and development of children enrolled in the service
- the setting, payment and collection of (additional hours fees, or long day-care parent fees minus the Free Kindergarten Funding).



POLICY STATEMENT

VALUES

Doncaster Kindergarten is committed to:

- supporting the Victorian Government's Free Kindergarten initiative
- increasing access to quality kindergarten programs for all Victorian children
- ensuring there are no financial barriers for families wishing to access an early childhood program for their child/children
- maintaining confidentiality in relation to the financial circumstances of parents/guardians.

SCOPE

This policy applies to the approved provider, persons with management or control, nominated supervisor, persons in day-to-day charge, early childhood teachers, educators, staff, parents/guardians attending Doncaster Kindergarten.

BACKGROUND AND LEGISLATION

BACKGROUND

The Best Start, Best Life reform will help all Victorian children dream even bigger through increased access to quality early childhood education and care. A critical part of the reform is Free Kindergarten, which will support access to two years of high-quality kindergarten programs for all Victorian children. All families with a child enrolled in a funded kindergarten program are eligible for Free Kindergarten, this includes both 3 and 4-year-old kindergarten programs.

Free Kindergarten supports families to access a funded kindergarten program by:

- providing a free 15-hour program to four-year-old children enrolled at a sessional service
- providing a free 5-to-15-hour program to three-year-old children enrolled at a sessional service (subject to the length of funded program offered). Doncaster Kindergarten provides 7 hours of three-year-old kindergarten in 2023
- offsetting the funded kindergarten program component of parent fees for three and fouryear-old children enrolled at a long day care service

Free kindergarten supports every Victorian child to get the best start in life no matter where they live. Research shows that play-based learning is a powerful way to support children's learning and development. Two years of early learning is a crucial part of their educational journey, these benefits last into the school years and beyond.

Regulation 168(2) (n) of the Education and Care Services National Regulations 2011 requires that funded services have a comprehensive written fees policy, and the content of this policy must be communicated to families. Any voluntary parent donations and/or fundraising must comply with the Free Kindergarten subsidy guidelines and be responsive to the local community.

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DEFINITIONS

The terms defined in this section relate specifically to this policy. For regularly used terms e.g. Approved provider, Nominated supervisor, Notifiable complaints, Serious incidents, Duty of care, etc. refer to the Definitions file of the PolicyWorks catalogue.

Approved child care: Approved child care services are services that have Australian Government approval to receive the Child Care Subsidy *(refer to Definitions)* on behalf of eligible parents. Approved child care includes centre-based day care, including long day care and occasional care, family day care, outside school hours care and in-home care.

Child care subsidy (CCS): A Commonwealth Government means tested subsidy to assist eligible families with the cost of child care. Payments are paid directly to approved child care providers. Further information can be found at: www.education.gov.au/child-care-subsidy

Early Start Kindergarten: A funding program that enables three-year-old Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children, and children known to Child Protection to attend a kindergarten program that is planned and delivered by an early childhood teacher for up to 15 hours per week. Details are available at: <u>www.education.vic.gov.au</u>. Children that are eligible for Early Start Kindergarten (ESK) will continue to be enrolled, this ensure that service providers receive all funding entitlements and that these children have access to 15 funded hours of kindergarten across Victoria. ESK enrolments contribute to School Readiness Funding (SRF) calculations for service providers. It also allows the Department to continue to monitor efforts to engage the most vulnerable children in kindergarten across Victoria and provide additional targeted support where required through SRF or Early Childhood LOOKOUT.

Application fee: A fee for when families register their child directly with a service. This fee will not be refunded as it is not part of the Free Kindergarten subsidy, and not related to the fee charged for delivery of the kindergarten program. A \$25 application fee is charged for each separate year of kinder, however will not be charged for any children attending a second year of funded 4-year-old kindergarten.

Excursion/service event charge: An additional charge required to meet the cost of special events or excursions that occur in response to emerging children's program needs. Events that are planned ahead and are included as an expenditure item in the service's budget do not incur this additional charge (*refer to Excursions and Service Events Policy*). Doncaster Kindergarten spend an average of \$25 per child per term on excursions and incursions. Instead of requesting multiple payments throughout the year, we will use the Enrolment deposit (*see definition below*) of \$100 to cover these additional expenses.

Fees: A charge for program hours over and above the 15 funded hours per week (600 per year) and/or wrap around care. This does not apply at Doncaster Kindergarten in 2023.

Free Kindergarten: A Victorian Government initiative providing free kindergarten programs for fouryear-old and three-year-old children in funded services

Enrolment deposit: A charge to secure a place that has been offered in a program at the service. This should not act as a barrier to enrolling for any families. Services must ensure that families understand that the enrolment deposits will only be refunded if the child commences in the service. If your child does commence at Doncaster Kindergarten, we will use this deposit to pay for the various incursions and excursions that will be arranged during the course of the year to save the need to charge families for each individual incursion. If the cost of incursions and excursions is less than \$100 over the course of the year, families will be reimbursed any difference (*see Excursion/service event charge above*).

Voluntary parent/guardian payment/donation: A voluntary payment/donation for items not directly related to the provision of the children's program. Explicit and written agreement from a parent is required for any voluntary payments. Attendance at the service is not conditional on this payment.

Wrap around care: care that is provided by a kindergarten service to kindergarten children outside of the 15 hours per week program. This is not offered at Doncaster Kindergarten.

- revise the policy and procedures as part of the service's policy review cycle, or as required
- notifying all stakeholders affected by this policy at least 14 days before making any significant changes to this policy or its procedures, unless a lesser period is necessary due to risk (*Regulation 172 (2)*).

ATTACHMENT 1. FREE KINDERGARTEN INFORMATION FOR FAMILIES

Doncaster Kindergarten 2023

1. General information

Kindergarten programs for four-year-old and eligible three-year-old children in Victorian Government funded services will be free as part of the Best Start, Best Life reform.

This investment will save families up to \$2,500 for each child enrolled in a participating funded kindergarten program.

DET also provides funding to assist eligible three-year-old Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children, and children known to Child Protection, to access kindergarten programs.

2. What free kindergarten means at our service

Doncaster Kindergarten has opted in to the Free Kindergarten initiative. Applicable parent fees are outlined below:

- Funded sessional kindergarten for 3-year-old children (7 hours per week) no parent fee
- Funded sessional kindergarten for 4-year-old children (15 hours per week) no parent fee

Doncaster Kindergarten will use your Enrolment deposit (*refer to Definitions*) payment that has already been paid upon acceptance of enrolment, to cover the costs of Excursion/service events held at various times during the year.

- **Excursion/service event charge:** At times throughout the year an additional excursion(s) or event(s) may be arranged where it is considered relevant to the service's program and the children's interests. At this time any additional costs to families are taken into consideration before a decision is made (*refer to Excursions and Service Events Policy*).
- Any voluntary parent donations/payments that you agree to in writing.

3. Other charges

Other charges levied by Doncaster Kindergarten are as follows:

Late collection charge:

The Committee of Management reserves the right to implement a late collection charge when parents/guardians are frequently late (3 times or more per term) in collecting their child/children from the service.

In these situations, the following procedures will apply:

• The qualified staff member will discuss with parents/guardians/carer any barriers that may be impacting on their ability to collect their child on time and inform the parents/guardians/carer that if it continues the Committee will be notified and the family will be given a written notice regarding implementation of a late collection charge should it occur a four th time.

• If after the reminder is issued, the parents/guardians/carer is between 10 and 30 minutes late, a charge of \$45.00 for every 15 minutes, or part thereof, from the conclusion of the session will be invoiced by the Committee.

4. Fundraising and voluntary parent payment/donations

While **participation in fundraising/donation is voluntary**, the support of every family is encouraged. Fundraising activities are also an opportunity for families and communities to come together.

5. Support services

Families experiencing financial hardship often require access to family support services. Information on these services may be available from the kindergarten service provider or alternatively families may contact the local council.
